

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

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DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Central to our capacity to heal, is our willingness to forgive.

In 2015 I was invited to join in the development of a musical adaptation of Eleanor H. Porter's beloved novel *Pollyanna*, one of literature's best known children's books.

At the time, it never occurred to any of us on the team that it would be 8 years before we would bring *Pollyanna* to the stage; but then who could have foreseen the global health crisis that would take hold of our world in the late winter of 2020.

Pollyanna is a story about home, family and love. It is about forgiveness, redemption and the healing that follows.

Over the course of its narrative *Pollyanna* introduces us to the people of Beldingville, Vermont who for years have lived lonely lives of self-imposed isolation, and who, through the innate wisdom and kindness of a child, grow to become a true community

The proverb that tells us 'good things come to those who wait' describes perfectly the journey that has brought this musical so full of heart and humour, and with a message that is both poignant and timely, to its premiere production at the wonderful Theatre Aquarius.

All of us engaged in creating this production are so proud of this work, and we are so glad you are here.

When Linda handed me a novel about an optimistic orphan named Pollyanna and said, "I think we should write a musical", I was a little skeptical. How could we create a show that would resonate with modern audiences based on a hundred-year-old book? But as I read Pollyanna's story (and cried!) I understood that her message of acceptance and hope is precisely what we need in these turbulent times. As Linda and I wrote (and re-wrote – and re-wrote) our show, we always kept that theme of acceptance at the forefront of our minds. Pollyanna not only sees the best in people, she helps them see the best in themselves and those around them. She is utterly unafraid of the unknown and curious about those who may be different from her.

Pollyanna accepts people for who they are and embraces those differences. It's a simple but powerful philosophy that we hope you carry with you long after you leave the theatre. Linda and I are so grateful to the dozens of Canadian theatre artists who supported us along our journey, and to Theatre Aquarius for helping us share this story with you.

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
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
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
